




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### BMW Eco-Sled

Bonneville Salt Flats, UT




Tahkovoouri, Nilsia, Finland






Frottmanning, Munich, Germany








### LOGO-ECOlodge




### Edge Dynamic




### Earth & Sky

The BMW Ecolodge in the low desert draws porous boundaries between building, landscape, and night sky by forming the building from the earth of the site, while creating a cool sink below grade to create a comfortable microclimate despite the desert's extreme temperatures. Four cool towers offer a graceful landmark to the nearby interstate and communicate BMW's technological sophistication and commitment to environmental sustainability. From the Ecolodge, views of the western sky are intensified and framed for maximum dramatic impact while views of the immediate surroundings are minimized. The drought-resistant vegetation and gently graded landscape restore a site damaged by previous development and neglect.




### Car Cloister in the Desert





### Insolation Flux


